At 4:45 p.m., Monday, August 1, 2022, members of the Davie County Board of Elections met for a monthly business meeting and for Melissa Parker to be sworn in as the new Director of Elections. Present were Gary LeBlanc, Faye Carter, Robert Raisbeck, Carole Demmy, Tabatha Parrish, Melissa Parker and 2 members of the public John Gallimore and Alan Parker. Luther Potts as not at the swearing in, but attended the board meeting.

Tabatha Parrish swore in Melissa Parker. The board reviewed the Director of Elections designation of duties. Carole Demmy moved the approval. The motion was unanimously approved.

The One Stop Implementation plan for the November 8, 2022, General Election was discussed. Board and staff agreed unanimously that the same schedule as the May 2022 Primary would be used. Luther Potts made a motion to approve the November 8, 2022, One Stop Implementation plan. The motion passed unanimously.

The minutes from the July 5th and 19th meeting were reviewed. Faye Carter moved the approval of the minutes. The minutes were unanimously approved.

The Board and staff discussed and set yearly goals for Melissa Parker and the office for the upcoming year.

Director Parker provided the Board with information of Sarah Moore's withdrawal of candidacy from the Davie Soil and Water Conservation District Supervisor Candidacy. Due to her being a federal employee, it was advised by her Office of Council to withdraw her candidacy. All documentation was reviewed and the board agreed with her withdrawal.

The Board and staff discussed applications that have been submitted and the upcoming interview with Cindy Kirkus. All agree to do a round table of questions. Interview is set for August 3, 2022, at 6:00 p.m. at the Board of Elections office.
