Programs & Athletics

Athletics

- Youth Volleyball League: season has ended.

Programs

- Mid-Eastern Martial Arts: has continue to increased participants, May totaled to 61.
- Dance/Tumbling Programs has ended as our instructor has moved from this area. We are searching for a replacement instructor.
- Zumba: Registered participants continue to stay stead. April had 4 monthly registration with 55 total drop-ins.

C. DIRECTORS REPORT

- County budget was approved by BOC on 6/10. Highlights for DCRP
 - Projected cost recovery 20%
 - One new F/T position
 - One upgraded position from 999 hourly to 29.5 hourly w/ retirement benefits
 - Increased Community Recreation Agency Grant to \$80k
 - Capital building improvements include Stadium Re-brand
 - Capital outlay includes dog park playground equipment, flagpole display, pedestrian lighting switch control, emergency exit/panic doors (4), north stadium re-landscape.
- Mobile recreation unit – quotes received, PO submitted and moving forward. Anticipated completion in mid July.
- New temporary part-time staff hired: Patricia Lorick and Katterin Hernandez.
- Recreation Specialist Mercedes Furr is on temporary leave to fulfill internship requirements at WFBMC.
- Recreation Specialist Aiden Treier recently graduated from DCHS and will be attending Appalachian State in August.
- Completed Leadership Davie session on 6/3.
- New hires made for River Park. Park re-opened to the public on 5/28 with new gate entry fee in-effect. Averaging between 80-85 cars per day with majority of traffic on weekends.
- Surveillance system install is 80% complete.
- Park greenway additions are complete.
- Dog park access gate controls damaged by storm were replaced and now operational.
- Participated in Community Event Day at WinMock on 6/5.
- Amanda and Paul recruited and accepted request by NCRPA to serve on statewide conference committee. Amanda volunteered for registration committee, and Paul volunteer to be Co-Chair for all committees.
