At 4:45 p.m. Monday, May 23, the members of the Davie County Board of Elections met to review provisional ballots and absentee ballots that were received in the office after Monday, May 16 at 5:00 p.m., postmarked by May 17, and received no later than Friday, May 20. Present were Luther B. Potts, Selma Suiter, Robert Raisbeck, Faye Carter, Carole Demmy, Tabatha Parrish, and Melissa Parker.

Five absentee ballots were reviewed and found to be properly signed, witnessed and received in a timely manner. Luther Potts moved the approval of the ballots and the motion was unanimously approved. The approved ballots were removed from the envelopes and tabulated in the presence of the Board. Absentee abstract was completed and signed by all board members.

Three absentee ballots were reviewed and found to be delivered on May 18 without a postmark. Robert Raisbeck moved to reject the ballots and the motion was unanimous.

Forty Six provisional ballots were reviewed. Twenty six were found to be properly executed and eligible to count. Faye Carter moved the approval of the ballots and the motion was unanimously approved. The approved ballots were removed from the envelopes and tabulated in the presence of the Board.
