Programs & Athletics

Athletics

- Adult Basketball Church League is wrapping up on April 12 with 6 teams this season.
- Indoor Tennis has ended with 9 participants.
- Youth Lacrosse League is taking place with 56 players this season!
- Try Lax Intro Program has started with 9 players.
- Youth Volleyball League has started practice with games schedule to start April 25. We have 96 players that make up 11 teams this season (4 more teams than last year).
- Senior Games: We have host events at the park in partnership with Senior Services.
