At 4:45 p.m., Monday, February 7, the members of the Davie County Board of Elections met for a monthly meeting. Present were Faye Carter, Luther Potts, Robert Raisbeck, Carole Demmy and Tabatha Parrish. Gary LeBlanc attended by telephone.

The Board reviewed the Davie County primary one-stop plan for the May 17, 2022 Election. The plan offered voting Monday through Friday, 8:00 am to 7:30 pm from April 28 through May 13 and Saturday, May 14 8:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. as required by law. The plan offered one-stop early voting at the Board of Elections office, Bermuda Run Town Hall, and Jerusalem VFD. Carole Demmy moved to approve 2022 Primary one-stop plan. Luther Potts provided a second and the plan was unanimously approved. The Board discussed one stop plans for a second primary if required and chose to have one stop voting in the Board of Elections office only.

Director Parrish reported to the Board that Roy Davidson has agreed to serve as the Chief Judge in the Hillsdale Precinct. Faye Carter moved to appoint Roy Davidson as the Chief Judge in the Hillsdale precinct. Carole Demmy provided a second and the plan was unanimously approved. Director Parrish reported to the Board that South Calahaln still has an opening for a Democratic Judge. The Democratic Party chair will be contacted for assistance with the search.

Director Parrish spoke with the Board regarding request for reclassification of the Senior Elections Specialist position to Deputy Director to reflect the importance and duties of the position when compared to nearby counties. Carole Demmy made a motion requesting Director Parrish submit a reclassification of the position including changing the position title and a salary increase to match the reclassification. .

The minutes from the January 3 meeting were reviewed. Robert Raisbeck moved the approval of the minutes. The motion was unanimously approved.
