Regular Session**

1. Meeting Called to Order - Chair Jones

The meeting was called to order at 6:00 PM

2. Invocation - Rev. Randy Perdue

The invocation was offered by Randy Perdue.

3. Pledge of Allegiance - Terry Funderburk

The Pledge of Allegiance was led by Terry Funderburk.

4. Ethics & Conflicts Disclosure - County Attorney, Ed Vogler

County Attorney Ed Vogler stated: "Pursuant to NCGS 160A-86 and the Davie County Board of Commissioners Code of Ethics adopted December 2, 2019, I would ask each of you before you adopt the agenda if there is any actual, potential or perceived conflicts of interest with respect to any matter on the proposed agenda which will come before the Board for a vote at this meeting today. If so, please speak up and let the Board know at this time before the agenda is adopted." No Commissioner spoke. Vogler then stated, "It is therefore concluded that there are no actual, potential, or perceived conflicts of interest by any Board member."

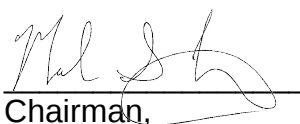

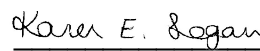
14. Adjourn - Chair Jones

To foster understanding, and quell the stigma surrounding the topic of suicide, Partners Health Management has been facilitating Community Conversations regarding Suicide. Participation is free and open to the public. Any interested person is welcome to attend. The program includes some facts about suicide, videos from a neighboring county regarding their issue with and initiatives to slow the rate of suicides.

The discussion Facilitator will be Tiffany Hall, LCSW and adjunct professor of Social Work at UNC-Greensboro. She also works with the Salisbury Veterans (SBY VA) Suicide Prevention team. In addition, Ms. Hall is trained to teach CALM (Counsel on ACCESS to Lethal Means). And is a proud supporter of the American Foundation for Suicide Prevention.

We welcome folks who have experienced suicide or are concerned about suicide. The atmosphere will be understanding and nonjudgemental, and there will be support for those who may be overwhelmed by the discussion. Please join us to consider this important topic and add your voice to our understanding and efforts to reduce deaths by suicide.
