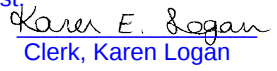

Register of Deeds

- In May, the Register of Deeds Office added another online service for customer convenience at no cost to the county. Assumed Business Name forms can now be registered online through our website. Citizens can click a link and immediately be directed to a portal where they can complete and submit their ABN applications. It's as easy as 1, 2, 3! The applications come right into the office as electronic recordings without the need for the business owner to appear in person. This is just another example of the ROD Office adding an online service improving accessibility for citizens.

Also, S248 passed both House & Senate and was signed into law by Governor Stein granting ROD Offices the ability to issue adopted birth certificates through the NCDave system beginning January 1, 2026.

Cooperative Extension

- On May 6, the Agricultural Center Building Committee toured the Chatham County Agricultural Center and the construction site of the Randolph County Agricultural Center.
- Extension Hosts Summer Intern: N.C. Cooperative Extension, Davie County Center, is one of 37 County Extension offices in the state selected to host interns for the NC State Extension 2025 Summer Internship Program. The program received a record setting number of 188 applications from college students representing 45 institutions across the country. The internship program exposes students to the challenges and awards of community engagement work and helps them consider careers in agriculture, food systems, nutrition, youth development, family and consumer sciences, natural resources and environmental science. Anna Shore from Winston-Salem was selected for the Davie internship position. She is a rising junior at NC State University studying Nutrition Sciences. Anna will work with Davie Extension staff through July 30 assisting with 4-H Summer Fun programming, shadowing agents, and developing marketing materials as well as a few workshops of her own.
- Corn Variety Trial: The 2025 Western Piedmont Corn Variety trial was planted on May 22 in Davie County. We have 12 corn varieties to showcase this year. Thank you to Sam Howard for hosting our test plot!
- Pressure Canning Workshop: Extension hosted a full kitchen for an Intro to Pressure Canning workshop and demonstration held on May 15 at 5:30pm. Registration was closed for the class with eleven participants. Additional classes will be held over summer to meet the demand for home food preservation education.
- 4-H Achievement Day: On Saturday, May 31, 4-H'ers and their families gathered at the Farmington Community Center to celebrate a year of growth, learning, and leadership with Davie County 4-H. This special event recognized the incredible accomplishments of 4-H youth and volunteers throughout 2024. The 4-H Teen County Council helped plan and lead the event. Youth and volunteers received awards, project record book winners and the senior scholarship winner were announced and 4-H clubs and youth representing Davie 4-H at state events were recognized. We are incredibly proud of all of our 4-H'ers and can't wait to see what they accomplish next.

Health and Human Services

Social Services:

- Chasity Baughman recently attended Enforcement and Review and Adjustment trainings provided by the Policy and Training team. Agents also attended a webinar Provided by Policy and Training on North Carolina Child Support Guidelines. These trainings are important because they keep agents up to date on new policy and changes in procedure within Child Support.
- During DCHHS' mental health committee meeting, Shana Barus, Partners Behavior Health Clinical Director, and Stacie Lawrence, Partners Member Engagement Supervisor were introduced to the committee.
- Melissa Nevitt attended Trigger training last week in Sylva, NC. Triggers notify Child Support when something is preventing ACTS, Medicaid and/or Work first from communicating with each other. Melissa is responsible for figuring out what exactly the trigger is trying to tell us and correcting the issue.
- Lori Hendricks has established, recouped, and saved through Program Integrity efforts \$186,045.87 to date this FY.

Public Health:

- Public Health WIC staff attended the annual Breastfeeding Forum from NCWIC and Northwest AHEC. Information and techniques learned will help staff improve breastfeeding outcomes for our WIC participants.
- Congratulations to the Public Health Environmental Health team for securing a \$12,000 grant from The National Environmental Health Association (NEHA) and US Food & Drug Administration (FDA). Tiffany Eldridge submitted the grant proposal on behalf of Davie County Health and Human Services, Division of Public Health.
- National Public Health Week was celebrated from April 7th to April 13th.
- Public Health leadership staff met to discuss and develop a measles response plan last week. The plan will be shared with public health staff for preparedness purposes.
- Public Health secured a new vaccine freezer with NCDHHS grant funds.
- Environmental Health education visits are a new annual requirement for establishments that are inspected 3+ times per year. This is an opportunity for the food service managers and operators to review the previous inspections with the Environmental Health staff and ask questions.

Davie Center for Violence Prevention:

- Davie Center for Violence Prevention received funding from Family Violence Prevention and Services Act (FVPSA) Sexual Assault grant. A portion of the funding was used to purchase a camera complete with forensic imaging. The camera is a powerful tool to assist with crime detection. The camera is able to perform visible, fluorescent, contract, ultra violet and Infra-red examinations to help identify bodily fluids, bite marks, gunshot residue, fingerprints, and much more. The camera is housed at the DCSO however, it will be mutually shared for cases as needed. Having such evidence tremendously helps advocates, law enforcement, and prosecutors and most importantly, victims of child abuse, domestic violence and/or sexual assault. March 10, 2025 – Davie Center for Violence Prevention hosted the Piedmont Region Director of the NC Council for Women & Youth Involvement.

Veterans Services

- April 3, 2025 – Senior Services and Veterans Services partnered to host a breakfast social for 25 veterans. The guest speaker was Carol Walter with the NC State Veterans Home in Salisbury.

Cooperative Extension

- **Agricultural Disaster Crop Loss Program:** On April 1, the NCDA&CS announced that the application period was open to apply for nearly \$311 million in designated relief funds for NC farmers. \$200 million was earmarked for farmers in western NC for Helene damage, while over \$100 million was available for crop losses across the state. The application deadline was May 4, and farmers were told to reach out to their local Extension office for assistance with the web-based application. Davie farmers were eligible due to losses from drought last summer. Eighteen Davie County farmers with a total of 8,820 acres in losses visited the Davie Field Crops Agent for assistance with their applications over the month of April. Seven local farmers participated in this year's annual scale certifications. Farmers markets vendors and farm stand operators must have their scales certified every year.
- **Specialty Crops Horticulture Working Group:** The Davie Horticulture Agent was selected as the lead Extension Agent across the state to work with Dr. Jeanine Davis to plan and hold specialty crops related training opportunities for other Extension Agents in NC. Susan has been instrumental in starting the Piedmont Medicinal Herb Growers Group to support medicinal herb growers in this part of the state. She is also a guest speaker at the upcoming Wild Herb Weekend sponsored by the NC Herb Association held each July in Valle Crucis. She hosted a training on Marketing and Value-Added Products for fellow Extension Agents on April 1 at the Government Center with NCDA&CS and Extension specialists presenting. March 15, 2025 – 4th Annual District 4-H Rabbit and Poultry Show – Youth from 10 counties competed. The completion was created as an alternative to youth that wanted to learn about and show animals but do not have the space to raise traditional show animals, such as sheep, goats or cattle. Cayleigh and Alivia Shaw took 1st and 2nd place, respectively, in the Rabbit Senior Showmanship Class.
- **Farm Animal Day:** Over 400 Davie County second graders and homeschoolers attended Extension's annual Farm Animal Day field trip on April 30 at Lone Hickory Arena. Youth learned about the life cycles and production of animals in agriculture including cattle, goats, equine, chickens, and veterinary care. Youth also learned about bees, horticulture plants, field crops, by-products of plants and animals, and nutrition. Stations were presented by Extension staff and adult and youth volunteers, who are experts in their subject matter. The students also participated in hands-on experiences, which included planting seeds, interacting with the animals, and going on a hayride.
- **Davie Community Foundation Grant:** Davie County 4-H was awarded \$4,095 to support upcoming youth leadership development opportunities. These funds will be used to support 4-H Teen County Council activities, as well as to support youth in attending state level events, such as 4-H Congress held each July at NC State University.
