**Davie County - Board of Commissioners
Work Session**

1. Meeting Called to Order - Chair Jones

The meeting was called to order at 9:00 a.m. Commissioner Shoaf was noted as running late but en route.

2. Invocation - Jamon Gaddy

Jamon Gaddy gave the invocation.

3. Pledge of Allegiance - Meagan Tomlin

Commissioner Shoaf arrived at 9:02 a.m., and Meagan Tomlin led the Pledge of Allegiance.

4. Adopt Agenda - Chair Jones

Chair Jones stated that Item 7. a, *Temporary Seasonal Uses*, would be removed from the agenda and that a closed session would be held to discuss two topics.

Vice Chair Finney made a motion to adopt the amended agenda. Commissioner Renegar seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously, 5–0 (Jones, Finney, Poindexter, Renegar, Shoaf).

5. Report to Board - Brian Barnett

a. Jackie Copeland - Partners Health Management

Jackie Copeland provided an update on Partners Health Services for Davie County.

6. Pending Action Items - Brian Barnett

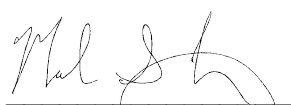

Chair Jones would like to include the closed session pursuant to G.S. 143.318-11(A)(3) To consult with an attorney employed or retained by the public body in order to preserve the attorney-client privilege between the attorney and the public body, which privilege is hereby acknowledged. General policy matters may not be discussed in a closed session and nothing herein shall be construed to permit a public body to close a meeting that otherwise would be open merely because an attorney employed or retained by the public body is a participant. The public body may consider and give instructions to an attorney concerning the handling or settlement of a claim, judicial action, mediation, arbitration, or administrative procedure. If the public body has approved or considered a settlement, other than a malpractice settlement by or on behalf of a hospital, in closed session, the terms of that settlement shall be reported to the public body and entered into its minutes as soon as possible within a reasonable time after the settlement is concluded.

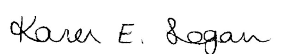
10. Adjourn - Chair Jones

- Tailored Plan Medicaid – 472; penetration rate – 16.6% (+3% points)

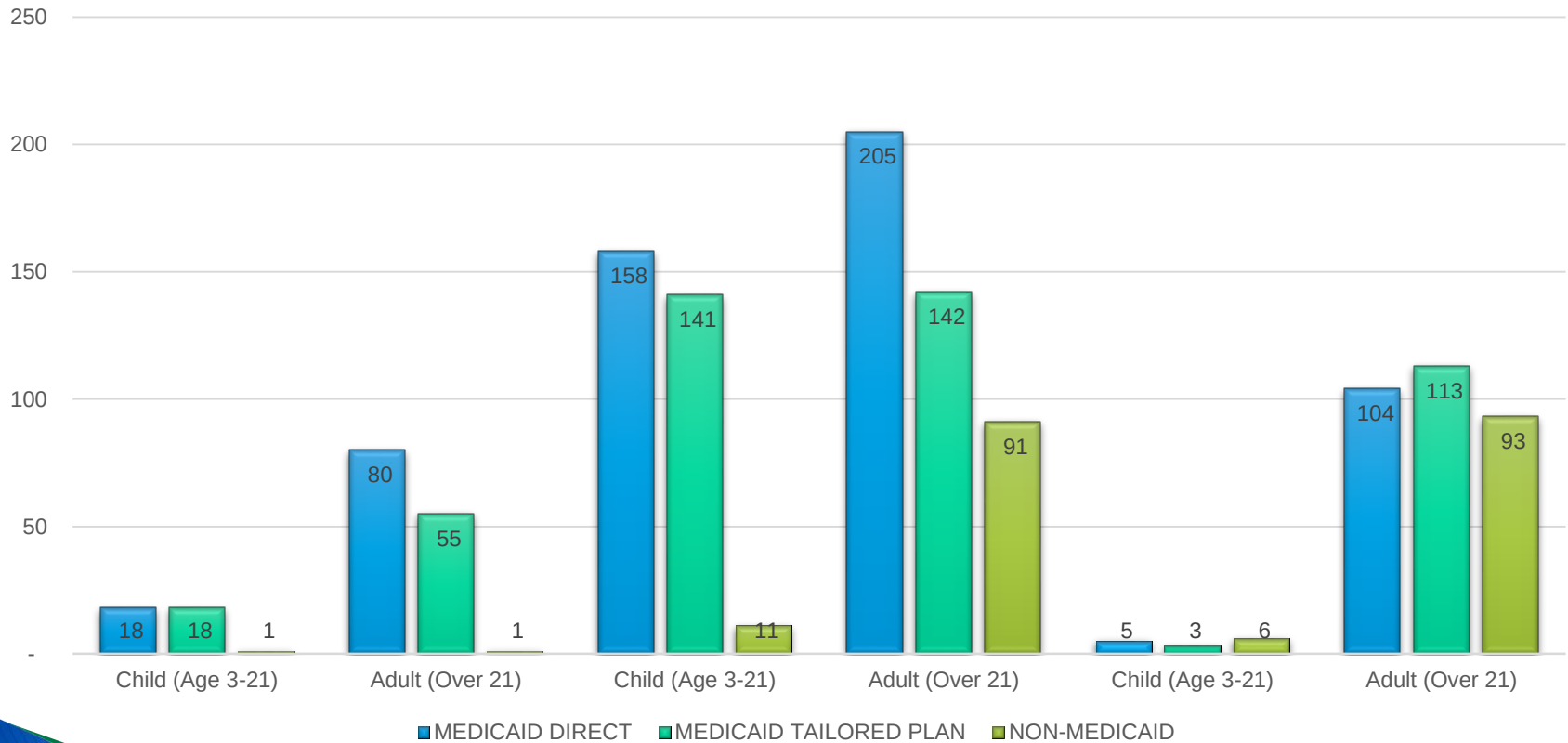
Davie County Non-Medicaid/State-funded Recipients - SFY25 Q3
