MINUTES

Davie County - Board of Commissioners Regular Session

1. Meeting Called to Order - Chair Finney

At 6:00 P.M. Chair Finney called the meeting to order.

2. Invocation - Shelby Harbour - Advance First Baptist Church

Shelby Harbour offered invocation.

3. Pledge of Allegiance - Beatriz and Tom O'Brien

The Pledge of Allegiance was led by Beatriz and Tom O'Brien.

4. Ethics & Conflicts Disclosure - County Attorney, Ed Vogler

County Attorney Ed Vogler stated: "Pursuant to NCGS 160A-86 and the Davie County Board of Commissioners Code of Ethics adopted December 2, 2019, I would ask each of you before you adopt the agenda if there is any actual, potential or perceived conflicts of interest with respect to any matter on the proposed agenda which will come before the Board for a vote at this meeting today. If so, please speak up and let the Board know at this time before the agenda is adopted." No Commissioner spoke. Vogler then stated, "It is therefore concluded that there are no actual, potential, or perceived conflicts of interest by any Board member."

5. Adopt Agenda - Chair Finney

Commissioner Jones stated that Commissioner Shoaf would like to add a budget discussion; this will be added as item 8. A, following the County Manager's Report.

Commissioner Jones made a motion to adopt the agenda. Commissioner Shoaf seconded the motion. All were in favor, and the motion passed 5-0 (Mark Jones, Benita Finney, Richard Poindexter, Terry Renegar, M Brent Shoaf)

6. Public Comment Period - County Attorney, Ed Vogler

a. Public Comment Period Rules

- Paul Moore spoke as a resident of Davie County to express his sincere appreciation for

the county's emergency services personnel, including 911 operators, first responders, and EMS staff. He shared a personal experience involving his mother, noting that the blood supplied during the emergency was instrumental in saving her life. He expressed deep gratitude for the care and professionalism shown.

- Gary Stowers had signed up to speak but was not present when called.

7. Public Hearing - Brian Barnett

a. Public Hearing Comment Rules

b. Point Road Closure - Johnny Easter

Development and Planning Services Director Johnny Easter presented on the Point Road Closure.

The Public Hearing was opened at 6:15 p.m. County Attorney Ed Vogler read the requirements for those who wish to speak during the public hearing.

- Travis Moorehead, executive director of Rivers Land Trust, explained that he is looking for more security for the property to move the gate to help with trust passing.

The Public Hearing was closed at 6:17 p.m. on a motion made by Commissioner Jones and seconded by Commissioner Shoaf. All were in favor, and the motion passed 5-0 (Jones, Finney, Poindexter, Renegar, Shoaf).

Commissioner Jones made a motion to close this portion of Point Road. Commissioner Poindexter seconded the motion. All were in favor, and the motion passed 5-0 (Jones, Finney, Poindexter, Renegar, Shoaf).

- ### c. Zoning Map Amendment DC26-C7-0055
- Neil Cornatzer has applied to amend the existing conditions on an approximate 2.9-acre parcel from General Industrial Conditional (GI-C) to General Industrial Conditional (GI-C). The subject property is located at 920 NC HWY 801 N. The property is further described as Davie County Tax Parcel C700000055.

Development and Planning Services Director Johnny Easter presented Zoning Map Amendment DC26-C7-0055. Neil Cornatzer submitted an application to amend the existing conditions on an approximately 2.9-acre parcel from General Industrial Conditional (GI-C) to General Industrial Conditional (GI-C). The subject property is located at 920 NC Highway 801 North and is further

identified as Davie County Tax Parcel C700000055.

The Planning Board unanimously approved the proposed conditions at its February 2026 meeting.

Commissioners Mark Jones and Chair Benita Finney inquired about the intended use of the property. Commissioner Jones specifically requested further clarification and written definitions for “Services B,” “Business,” and “Wholesale Trade A and B.”

Mr. Cornatzer explained that the property has most recently been used for a landscaping business, including storage of mowers and related equipment. He stated he intends to maintain a commercial use consistent with a landscaping operation. He also noted that he is working with a general contractor who performs grading work, which requires the use of heavy machinery. He indicated that he does not anticipate any significant changes from the previous use.

Commissioner Brent Shoaf asked whether specific prohibitions could be placed on the property. Mr. Easter confirmed that conditions could be written to limit or restrict certain uses.

The public hearing opened at 6:40 p.m. County Attorney Ed Vogler reviewed the procedures for public comment.

Jody Everett spoke in opposition to the request, expressing concerns about the enforcement of conditional zoning in Davie County and stating that he did not believe the proposal should be approved.

The public hearing was closed at 6:42 p.m. on a motion by Commissioner Poindexter, seconded by Commissioner Renegar. The motion passed unanimously, 5–0 (Jones, Finney, Poindexter, Renegar, Shoaf).

Following the hearing, Commissioner Shoaf requested guidance on how to proceed with establishing appropriate conditions. County Attorney Ed Vogler advised that the Board may specify approved conditions and require a formal agreement with the developer. The Board would need to determine the acceptable uses of the property.

Chair Finney expressed that additional time is needed to consider the matter and indicated a preference to defer the decision.

Commissioner Renegar made a motion to defer the proposed conditions until next month. This will be added to the May 4, 2026, meeting under old business. Commissioner Jones seconded the motion. All were in favor, and the motion passed 5-0 (Jones, Finney, Poindexter, Renegar, Shoaf).

d. Rescind Special Permits for Subdivisions, Zoning Ordinance Chapter 155 — Johnny Easter

Johnny Easter presented amendments to the Zoning Ordinance regarding the rescission of the Special Permits for subdivision in Chapter 155 of the Code of Ordinance for Davie County.

The Public Hearing was opened at 7:01 p.m. County Attorney Ed Vogler read the requirements for those who wish to speak during the public hearing.

The Public Hearing was closed at 7:02 p.m. on a motion made by Commissioner Shoaf and seconded by Commissioner Jones. All were in favor, and the motion passed 5–0 (Jones, Finney, Poindexter, Renegar, Shoaf).

Commissioner Jones asked for an explanation of why this rescission is needed. Johnny Easter explained that this is to protect the County from any legal action regarding down zoning.

Commissioner Shoaf made a motion to rescind the special permits for subdivision, zoning ordinance chapter 155, which was previously approved during the February 5, 2026, meeting. Commissioner Poindexter seconded the motion. The motion passed 4-1 (Finney, Poindexter, Renegar, Shoaf YAYS) (Jones - NAYS)

e. Subdivision Ordinance Chapter 154 — Johnny Easter

Johnny Easter presented the proposed subdivision changes.

Johnny Lambert stated that the wording could be added that the public water requirement must be defined by the Davie County public utility ordinance.

Commissioner Poindexter would like to encourage builders and developers to use public water whenever necessary.

Johnny Lambert stated that the public water requirement could read: "Any subdivision which has public water lines available within 5000 ft if the flow and pressure are available and adequate shall extend the public water system throughout the subdivision to each lot as required," instead of the 1000 feet originally proposed.

The Public Hearing was opened at 7:46 p.m. County Attorney Ed Vogler read the requirements for those who wish to speak during the public hearing.

- Todd Naylor asked for consideration to provide water for fire protection for new developments.
- Jody Everette told the board to be bold and add restrictions to protect our County.

The Public Hearing was closed at 7:50 p.m. on a motion made by Commissioner Shoaf and

seconded by Commissioner Poindexter. All were in favor, and the motion passed 5–0 (Jones, Finney, Poindexter, Renegar, Shoaf).

Commissioner Shoaf made a motion to adopt the 5-acre rule (Major Subdivisions where each lot within the subdivision is at least five acres. TRC and Staff approval of the site plan is required). Commissioner Renegar seconded the motion. All were in favor, and the motion passed 5-0 (Jones, Finney, Poindexter, Renegar, Shoaf)

Commissioner Renegar made a motion to defer the proposed subdivision ordinance changes in Chapter 154, except for the 5-acre rule. Commissioner Poindexter seconded the motion. All were in favor, and the motion passed 5-0 (Jones, Finney, Poindexter, Renegar, Shoaf).

8. County Manager's Report / Consent Agenda Overview - Brian Barnett

County Manager Brian Barnett presented his monthly review. He also introduced Caswell Moore, the intern from Davie High School.

8. A. - Budget Discussion was added before the agenda was adopted.

Commissioner Shoaf made a statement on changes that have been made regarding the budget during his tenure on the board of commissioners. He wanted to share facts regarding data on the recent tax reevaluation. He states that Davie County must maintain a sustainable budget. He is requesting that the tax rate be lowered by another 4 cents. He doesn't want the cuts to affect any of the services that are provided by the County.

9. Consent Agenda - Chair Finney

Chair Finney read the autism awareness month proclamation and made mention of the other proclamations that are to be approved.

Commissioner Jones asked for clarification on the budget amendment regarding the fund balance to fund an assistant EMS director. County Manager Barnett recommended that it would be a good idea to go ahead and approve this tonight instead of waiting until budget season.

Chair Finney wanted clarification on the library entrance, and Brian Barnett explained that it would be a call for the Library Board of Trustees, but the funding would be set aside with these funds.

Commissioner Renegar made the motion to approve the consent agenda. Commissioner Poindexter seconded the motion. All were in favor, and the motion passed 5-0 (Jones, Finney, Poindexter, Renegar, Shoaf)

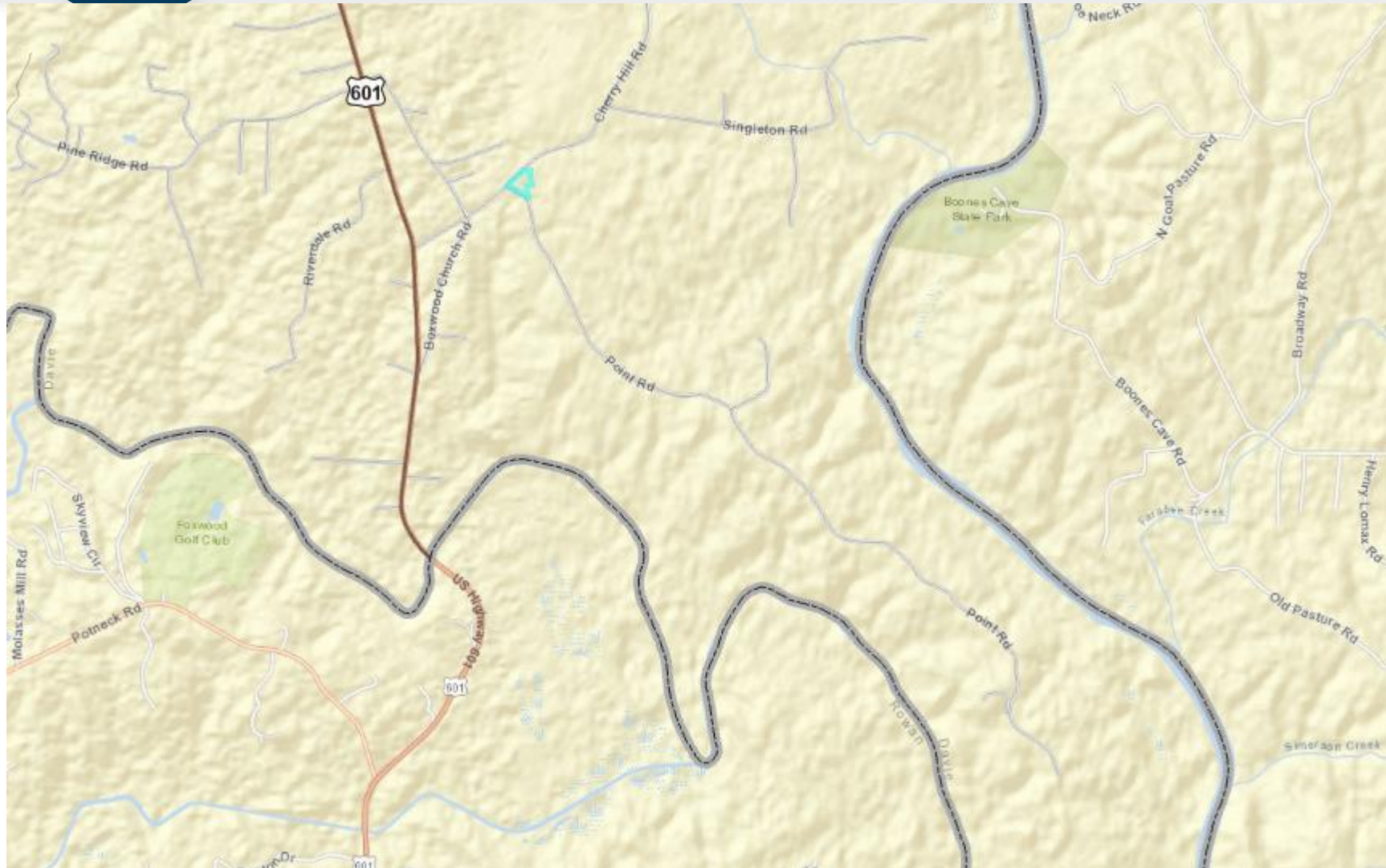

Proposed Subdivision Ordinances Changes



Proposed Subdivision Changes

-Buffers

All Major Subdivisions shall have a Type C buffer strip installed around the perimeter.

Type C.

(a) Buffer: Ten feet.

(b) Screening shall consist of:

1. A row of evergreen conifers or broadleaf evergreens placed not more than five feet apart which would grow to form a continuous hedge of at least six feet in height within two years of planting; and

2. Lawn, low-growing evergreen shrubs, evergreen ground cover, or rock mulch covering the balance of the buffer.

Proposed Subdivision Changes



-Parking Areas

All lots in a major subdivision shall meet the following requirements:

(A) Off-street parking space shall be provided in accordance with this provision.

(B) The off-street parking required by this subchapter shall be permanent space and shall not be used for any other purposes.

(C) Each parking space shall not be less than nine feet by 18 feet.

(D) New parking areas shall be able to accommodate 6 vehicles.



Proposed Subdivision Changes



-Setbacks

All lots in a major subdivision shall meet the following requirements:

Front yard setback. 40 feet shall be minimum setback of the principal structure, measured from the nearest point of the building and the right-of-way line.

-or-

Front yard setback. 40 feet shall be minimum setback of the principal structure, measured from the nearest point of the building and the right-of-way line; with every other lot having a 30 foot minimum setback of the principal structure, measured from the nearest point of the building and the right-of-way line.



-Lots Larger than 5 ac.

Major Subdivisions where each lot within the subdivision is at least five acres.
TRC and Staff approval of site plan.

Proposed Subdivision Changes

■ Open Space

To qualify as common open space, land shall be usable for recreation purposes or shall provide visual, aesthetic or environmental amenities and may not be occupied by streets, drives, parking areas, or structures other than recreational structures. At least 30% of the gross area (unless otherwise allowed by the Davie County Board of Commissioners dedicated (for open space) must be suitable for and designed to be used as active recreation space (for example, walking trails, ball fields, community swimming pools, playgrounds and the like).

Open space shall be held in common ownership by a homeowner's association as public open space.

Proposed Subdivision Changes



■ Public Water Requirement

Major subdivision shall meet the following requirements:

County or Municipal Public Water.

County or Municipal Public Water is required in a Major Subdivision as follows:

Any subdivision which has public water lines available within 1000 foot shall extend the public water system throughout the subdivision to each lot as required.



Proposed Subdivision Changes

■ **Clustered Mailbox Units**

Major subdivision shall meet the following requirements:

- When cluster mailbox units are required by the US Postal Service, they shall be configured in accordance with the following:
- Cluster mailbox units shall be configured in accordance with all applicable USPS standards.
- Cluster mailbox units shall be served by a sidewalk connected to the larger pedestrian network in the development, or shall provide at least two designated parking spaces that provide safe and unobstructed access to the mailbox unit.
- Cluster mailbox units shall be covered to protect pedestrians from inclement weather while accessing their individual mailbox.
- Cluster mailbox units shall be served by exterior illumination of at least 2 foot-candles to ensure safety during night time hours.
- Cluster Mailbox Units must be located on a lot or area dedicated for open space or public access easement obtained by the developer.
- Cluster Mail Box Units may not be placed in the Right of Way (ROW) of any road.
- The location of the Cluster Mailbox Unit within the subdivision shall be determined by the Zoning Administrator or Subdivision Administrator; local Post Master; and developer or builder.

■ Underground Utilities

Major subdivision shall meet the following requirements:

Underground utilities. Electrical, fiber optic, cable, and telephone utility lines installed within major subdivisions shall be underground unless the Planning and Development Services Department determines underground installation is inappropriate; without expense to Davie County.

■ Performance Guarantees

Major subdivision shall have a Performance Guarantee:

§ 160D-804.1. Performance guarantees. To assure compliance with G.S. 160D-804 and other development regulation requirements, a subdivision regulation may provide for performance guarantees to assure successful completion of required improvements.

§ 155.125 TABLE OF USE DISTRICTS.

A. *Types of uses by districts.*

(1) X. Indicates permitted uses.

(2) S. Indicates special use required.

(3) P. Indicates permitted uses that must be approved by the Project Review Committee to ensure compliance with the prescribed development standards.

(4) P/C. Indicates permit required from Zoning Administrator; use must meet additional conditions.





Proposed Subdivision Changes

§ 155.151 SPECIAL PURPOSE DISTRICT (S-P).

(A) *Intent.*

(1) The Special Purpose District is established to accommodate uses that may constitute health or safety hazards, have greater than average impacts on the environment, aesthetics, community identity, view shed or diminish the use and enjoyment of nearby property by generation of noise, smoke, fumes, odors, glare, vibration, commercial vehicle traffic, or similar nuisances.

(2) If there are discrepancies with this section and § [155.130](#)(BB), the stricter requirements shall prevail.

(B) *Dimensional requirements* (Major Subdivisions).



Proposed Subdivision Changes

- (1) *Lot size.* Twenty-five acres shall be the minimum lot area. Any part of the property located in the road right-of-way shall not be included in this minimum lot area.
- (2) *Lot width.* No specified minimum.
- (3) *Front yard.* One hundred feet shall be the minimum setback of the structure or any installed equipment, measured from the nearest point of the building and the right-of-way line.
- (4) *Side yard setback.* Twenty-five feet shall be the minimum side yard for each structure or any installed equipment, measured from the nearest point of the building to the side lot line.
- (5) *Rear yard setback.* Forty feet shall be the minimum rear yard for each structure or any installed equipment, measured from the point of the building nearest the rear line and the rear lot line.
- (6) *Off-street loading and unloading.* Buildings constructed or converted to uses permitted in this district shall provide off-street loading and unloading space as required in §§ [155.070](#) through [155.072](#) of this chapter.
- (7) *Off-street parking.* Requirements specified in §§ [155.050](#) through [155.053](#) of this chapter.



Proposed Subdivision Changes

(8) *Buffer strip.* Upon any lot line that abuts a residential district or public street, there shall be a densely planted and maintained Type B buffer strip as specified in § [155.172](#) of this chapter.

(C) *Access.* Except for Solar Energy Generating Facilities **and Major Subdivisions**, which shall require access to a state-maintained road, the Special Purpose site shall be accessed by a major or minor arterial road way as identified on the Davie County Comprehensive Transportation Plan.

(D) *Community meeting.* The applicant shall organize and conduct a community meeting with the surrounding property owners at a minimum of 30 days prior to the scheduled Planning Board meeting date. The petitioner must file in the office of the County Clerk a written report of any community meeting held by the petitioner. The report shall include, among other things, a listing of those persons and organizations contacted about the meeting and the manner and date of contact, the date, time and location of the meeting, a roster of the persons in attendance at the meeting, a summary of issues discussed at the meeting, and a description of any changes to the rezoning petition made by the petitioner as a result of the meeting.

(E) A second community meeting shall be arranged by the application following the Planning Board meeting and notes submitted to the Planning Department at least 15 days prior to the next regular Board of Commissioners meeting.





Proposed Subdivision Changes

(F) *Community meetings For Major Subdivisions.* The applicant shall organize and conduct two community meetings with the surrounding property owners, within a 500' radius, at a minimum of 30 days prior to the scheduled Planning Board meeting date. The meetings shall be held at least 14 days apart. The petitioner must file in the office of the County Clerk a written report of the community meetings held by the petitioner. The report shall include, among other things, a listing of those persons and organizations contacted about the meetings and the manner and date of contact, the date, time and location of the meetings, a roster of the persons in attendance at the meetings, a summary of issues discussed at the meetings, and a description of any changes to the rezoning petition made by the petitioner as a result of the meetings.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Davie County Board of County Commissioners do hereby proclaim April as NATIONAL CHILD ABUSE PREVENTION MONTH in Davie County and urge all citizens to recognize this month by building a narrative of hope for children and families through collaboration and the creation of an ecosystem of primary prevention. This is the 6th day of April, 2026.

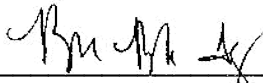

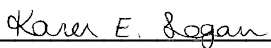

Cooperative Extension

- **4-H Embryology:** The 2026 program kicked off on February 4 with the first round of egg deliveries to Central Davie, Shady Grove and Mocksville Elementary Schools. William R. Davie, Pinebrook, Cooleemee, and Cornatzer Elementary Schools will participate in the second round, which starts March 10. For over 40 years, Davie County 4-H has partnered with all Davie County Elementary Schools to bring the NC 4-H Embryology curriculum to every second-grade classroom. This hands-on curriculum allows youth to observe the development of fertilized chicken eggs all the way through hatching to reinforce life cycle education aligning with NC Second Grade Science Standard LS.2.1.
- **Area Beef Conference:** The Area Beef Conference was held in Iredell County this year with 112 attendees. Producers from Davie and surrounding counties learned about New World Screwworm, Culling and Management for KY-31 Systems and the 2026 Beef Cattle Market Outlook from NC State Extension Specialists.
- **Gallup Clifton Strengths:** The Davie Extension team participated in the Clifton Strengths Finder assessment to learn more about one another and working more effectively as a team. Each staff member completed the online assessment to reveal their top five strengths, as well as the book, Strengths Finder 2.0. A member of the Extension Organizational Development team at NC State Extension facilitated the assessment and training.
- **Blueberry Pruning Workshop:** After rescheduling due to snow, Bill Cline, NCSU Researcher and Extension Specialist, traveled to Davie from the Castle Haynes Horticultural Crops Research Station to lead a Blueberry Pruning Workshop for 20 local producers. A local farm hosted the demonstration workshop on February 19, which was limited to 20 participants.
- **Goat Pregnancy Detection Workshop:** In partnership with the Piedmont Research Station, fourteen producers attended this hands-on workshop to learn signs, scans and skills for goat pregnancy detection. This workshop was limited to 15 participants, who learned how to collect blood samples, use side-chute pregnancy tests and perform ultrasounds.
- **Private Pesticide Applicator Training:** Eighteen licensed Davie County Private Pesticide Applicators received their required recertification credits to maintain their licenses on February 10. Private Pesticide licenses are for pesticide use on an individual's own farm or nursery, and applicators must attend a recertification training every three years. Davie County currently has 47 licensed Private Applicators, 73 licensed Commercial Applicators and 10 Public Operators that apply pesticides on behalf of the county or towns. A Commercial Pesticide license is required by landscapers and other applicators, who apply pesticides on properties that belong to others.
